

Covid-19 Policies & Procedures For Payson City Pool 2020



Utah County Code Regarding Covid-19:

The Yellow (low risk) requirements specific for pools, water parks, and spas are listed below:

- Open plunge operates at a reduced capacity that enables appropriate social distancing to be maintained between household groups on pool deck.
- 6-foot social distancing between household groups is maintained on pool deck (social distancing is not required in the water).
- Lap swim resumes to normal capacity.
- Swim team and swim lessons are allowed as long as social distancing is followed on pool deck.
- Maintain signage that encourages social distancing guidelines to be met at all times.

Payson City Policies & Procedures Regarding Covid-19:

General Rules:

- The facility will operate at no more than 50% normal capacity (no more than 400 people), or at a level that allows 6-foot distance between individuals and households.
- Signage will be posted throughout the facility to remind patrons of social distancing on the pool deck, in locker rooms, and in lines.
- Red tape will mark 6ft distances where lines typically form.
- Staff will regularly sanitize locker rooms, bathrooms, railings and other high touchpoint areas throughout the facility.
- Chairs are available for use and will be sanitized once daily. Additional sanitation is available upon request to the pool staff.
- Patrons who enter the facility are expected to govern themselves in regards to social distancing. Lifeguards WILL NOT enforce social distancing and must maintain focus on their primary responsibilities.

Symptom Checks and Screening:

- Patrons are encouraged to screen themselves based on the following criteria:
 - Have you traveled outside of the state/country in the last 14 days?
 - Have you been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 in the last 14 days or is exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19?
 - Are you experiencing any of the following symptoms?
 - Fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills or repeated shaking with chills, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell.

- If you or anyone you know answers “yes” to the above questions we encourage you to stay home.

* Payson pool reserves the right to excuse anyone from the facility that does not comply with pool rules, policies, and posted signage regarding social distancing and Covid-19 or who is believed to be a risk to public health.*

Staff & Safety Rules and Precautions:

- All staff will be screened for temperature and symptoms of Covid-19 upon arrival to the facility before beginning their shift. Any employee with a temp reading of 100.4 or higher will be sent home until symptoms subside and they are approved by administration to return to work.
 - Symptoms include but are not limited to:
 - Temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit
 - Coughing
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Chills, repeated shaking with chills
 - Headache
 - Sore Throat
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Close contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 or is exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19
 - Travel outside of the state/country
- An employee who has tested positive for Covid-19 must self-isolate for at least 14 days and must wait at least 7 days after the last signs of fever to be approved by administration to return to work.
- If a Payson Pool staff member tests positive for Covid-19 we will begin contact-tracing. All staff members who had any form of contact with them are required to test negative before returning to work. Where possible additional contact-tracing of patrons will be done.
- PPE will be provided to all staff including gloves and masks. PPE should be donned before any type of direct care or first-aid to a patron. Staff are encouraged but not required to wear masks where 6-foot distancing is not possible.
- In case of life threatening emergencies a Bag-Valve-Mask with a HEPA filter will be used instead of a pocket mask to avoid potential spread of airborne disease. After initial rescue, staff with proper PPE should take over care. If a victim is suspected of infection of Covid-19, care should not be provided until proper PPE can be worn.
